

How to use the Wright Tool Safety Program

Materials are available on our web site and are to be used to train tool users in the do's and don'ts of hand tool safety. Not only will this program give you peace of mind in knowing that employees have been properly trained, but it documents the fact that the training was conducted.

The Safety Training Program includes the 17-minute Hand Tool Safety Video, Safety Data Handouts and Decals to distribute to end users. It also includes a Safety Evaluation Form and Documentation Forms for employees to fill out upon completion of the training. These forms are then kept in the employees' personnel files.

This program is designed so that you can ensure that your workers have been taught how to safely use the products of Wright Tool. It will not only help protect your workers from accidents, it also will help protect your company against liability resulting from improper tool use.

Safety Training Video

This 17-minute video is a comprehensive training program on the right and wrong ways to use hand tools – specifically wrenches, sockets, ratchets and attachments. It includes safety tips, do's and don'ts, and instructions on how to use tools properly for all skill levels.

Safety Data Handouts

These sheets are provided for download on our web site and are to be handed out to end users after they view the video. The information summarizes what has been covered in the video and should be used by workers for future reference.

Safety Decals

Designed to be applied to a tool cabinet or toolbox, the safety decals provide tool users with a quick reference to end the confusion between inch and metric sizes. It also recommends

Safety Training Documentation

After the employees view the Wright Tool Safety Video, have them sign the documentation forms. These forms are to be kept in the employees' personnel files as proof that they received proper training in hand tool safety.
